

The Two Hit Hypothesis of EGS: Navigating Surgical Emergencies in Patients with Advanced Co-morbidities

Emergency General Surgery (EGS) is a pillar of Acute Care Surgery (ACS), in which surgeons are asked to operate on complex surgical emergencies in critically ill patients, who often have severe underlying co-morbidities or terminal conditions. This includes, but is not limited to, metastatic cancer, advanced cirrhosis, and decompensated heart failure. This educational session serves to equip ACS surgeons, residents, and advanced practitioners with the knowledge to navigate these complex EGS cases, including patient selection, techniques for operative intervention, opportunities to engage Palliative Care, and communication strategies in order to set appropriate expectations for these patients. Healing as a Team: Navigating Alcohol Use Disorder

Alcohol use disorder (AUD)* affects surgeons across all ages, racial and ethnic backgrounds, sexual and gender identities, and socioeconomic backgrounds. So You Want To Be A Division Chief


