

**EAST MULTICENTER STUDY**  
**GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORSHIP**

**For the initial publication:**

- The two lead center authors have the following choices for authorship (which is up to the discretion of the lead PI):
  - First and second author **OR**
  - First and last author
  - The PI from the lead center may allow for additional authorship from their center this includes additional research personnel (helped data collection, coordinate the study with the participating sites) and the statistician the completed the analysis.
- The PI and co-PI from each contributing institution will then be listed in order of highest study enrollment per center.
- To qualify for inclusion in the main authorship group, each site/PI is required to enroll and contribute a minimum of 10 patients to the study. Contributions of fewer than 10 patients will result in the participating site being recognized in the acknowledgments section of any published manuscripts, rather than being listed as a co-author.
- Only two authors from each enrolling center will be included as authors.
- All authors that do not fit on the title line based on the journal of publication requirements should be listed at the conclusion of the manuscript as members of the “EAST Multicenter Study Group on [XXX]” (e.g, the EAST Multicenter Study Group on ...).
- If the lead center has chosen to have first and last author authorship, then the study group will be listed as the last author (i.e. A, B, C, D, E, F, LAST AUTHOR, EAST Multicenter Study Group on [XXX]). This listing of the study group authors at the conclusion of the manuscript allows investigators to define themselves as a co-author of the manuscript under generally accepted rules of academic authorship for large multicenter studies.
- The lead PI will discuss all authorship criteria prior to the start of the center enrollment
- Any important supporting personnel, that do not meet authorship criteria, will be recognized in the Acknowledgement Section.
- All data user agreements should allow for bidirectional data exchange upon completion of the study and the primary analysis, to facilitate subsequent studies from the data set by the participating sites in conjunction with the lead center PI.

**For subsequent manuscripts:**

- For subsequent manuscripts that may be written, such as subset analyses, the title page authorship may be adjusted according to contribution to the creation of that manuscript.
- Prior to performing a subset analysis, the author should seek approval from the EAST MCT chair and original study PI to ensure all involved members are appropriately acknowledged and accounted for.
- The results of these subsequent investigations, along with the manuscript, will also be shared with all members of the original investigative group. The listing of the “EAST Study Group on [XXX]” at the conclusion of the manuscript, including all original investigators, should also be included in these subsequent reports. This will permit the original investigators to receive recognition of their work in collecting the data and allow them to appropriately list themselves as co-authors of subsequent works under the aforementioned organization.
